## Nicola Perrotti – President Institut Européen des Armes de Chasse et de Sport

Statement in the context of the Press Briefing 2022 Check against delivery!

The IEACS, which stands for Institut Européen des Armes de Chasse et de Sport (European Institute of Hunting and Sporting Arms), is a non-profit association founded in 1976 by national associations of manufacturers of sport shooting firearms from France, Belgium, Germany, Italy and Spain<sup>1</sup>.

More recently, the IEACS opened its membership also to the European trade associations of the sectors such as ESFAM (The Association of European Manufacturers of Sporting Firearms) and AFEMS (The association of European Manufacturers of Sporting ammunition and related components and machineries).

Through its membership, the IEACS represents virtually over 1.000 companies involved in the whole sector and about 150 manufacturers of civilian firearms across Europe.

The main markets of destination of our products are the US and Europe. Speaking about Europe, there are around 1.800 civilian firearms and ammunition manufacturers, 200 distributors and 14.000 retailers and over 300.000 collectors whose business is totally or largely dependent on the hunting or recreational shooting market. As a result, the total annual turnover of the European firearms industry is estimated around 6 billion euro, according to a survey recently conducted on our sector<sup>2</sup>.

The demand for civilian firearms increased in the last two years, mainly influenced by politics and the outbreak of COVID-19 in some of our main markets of destination. As a result, the world production of civilian firearms increased in the last couple of years, and so has the European production, which in 2020 registered 3.6 million firearms produced, of which 2.7 million were guns and 900.000 were shotguns and rifles<sup>3</sup>. Compared to the previous year, this means a 34% increase in the European firearms production.
